President's Letter

The year 2011 marked the 50th anniversary of C.G. Jung's death. With this in mind, ISAP paid due respect to Prof. Jung with three special events: A series of lectures and tours given by ISAP analysts at the Museum Rietberg in conjunction with the exhibition of *The Red Book*; a Symposium held at the ETH on the subject of "C.G. Jung in the Historical Context of the 1930's"; and an all-day Memorial on June 6 at the Kunsthaus of Zurich. All of these events were conducted in cooperation with other institutions, including the C.G. Jung Institute of Kusnacht, the Psychological Club, the Foundation for the Works of C.G. Jung, the Swiss Foundation Museum for Analytical Psychology after C.G. Jung, the Philemon Foundation, and the Federal Institute of Technology (ETH). This has been a year of collaboration and cooperation with a broad range of communities who share ISAP's interest in the recognition of Jung's work and Analytical Psychology in the public world.

With sadness, ISAP also had to take leave in 2011 of its beloved and esteemed senior training analyst and teacher, Dr. Mario Jacoby. Known to all of us simply as "Mario," he brought a charm, intelligence and a loving presence into our community for as long as we can remember. He was well celebrated at ISAP's Opening Tea in March with a shower of memories and accolades from colleagues of long standing, of which a booklet was made in his honor with the title *Liber Amicorum* (eds. Stacy Wirth and Murray Stein). Mario's health deteriorated over the summer, and he passed away on Oct. 1 at the age of 86. His funeral took place on October 8 in Zollikon, Mario's home of many years, in the company of friends and colleagues, all of whom were deeply moved by the grave-side ceremony conducted by Dr. Paul Brutsche and the words of appreciation spoken by friends and colleagues in the service following.

Looking at the present situation at ISAP, I am happy to report that the training program is thriving and in excellent spirits. We are blessed not only with a dedicated faculty but also with a group of outstandingly gifted and talented students to match. The student organization has been actively engaged during the year in exchanges with analysts about the present state of ISAP and its vision for the future, in developing programs for students to share their gifts and achievements with one another, and in supporting ISAP activities with contributions of many kinds on all levels. As always, the Jungian Odyssey was a notable success in 2011, with a highly stimulating week shared by a full house at Monte Verita, the historic place overlooking Ascona and a favorite spot for Jungians since the 1930's. The theme of this year's JO was "The Playful Psyche: Entering Chaos, Coincidence, Creation." As the JO traditionally concludes the academic year at ISAP, the Zurich Lecture Series opens the new one in the Fall with an original work by an outstanding scholar offered to the community in the lovely environs of the Zunfthaus zur Meisen and the Lavater Haus in Zurich. This year, Josephine Evetts-Secker brilliantly delivered her reflections on the language of psychology: *At Home in the Language of the Soul* to a rapt audience. Her lectures will be published in 2012 by Spring Journal Books, as will the lectures given at the Jungian Odyssey. A veritable shower of publications have been released by ISAP analysts during the year, and these will continue to descend upon the reading public in 2012.

Jungian Odyssey

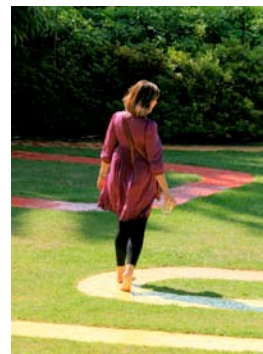
The Jungian Odyssey 2011 took place on the historic Monte Verità with some eighty participants representing twenty different countries and nearly as many backgrounds. Marveling throughout the week over the landscape, these brave souls became ever adept at navigating the steep hills on foot! A range of presenters, Jungian and others, supported our exploration of the challenging topic, "The Playful Psyche: Entering Chaos, Coincidence, Creation." ISAP president Murray Stein opened the retreat with a talk on synchronicity and emotion. Our keynote speaker, the physicist and founder of the Pari Center for New Learning, F. David Peat, introduced the question, "can physics dance again?" The ETH chemist, Prof. Reinhard Nesper, delved into the hard science of chaos, non-linearity and emergence, bringing the concepts within the grasp of our broad audience. The seeming polarities of play and science were

beautifully bridged by a number of ISAP lecturers along with the visiting Jungians, Beverley Zabriskie (New York) and Joe Cambray (Boston).

Another special guest was the jazz singer, voice therapist and NYU professor Lisa Sokolov (New York), whose voice workshop introduced an entirely new dimension to the traditional JO "experiential workshop." Indeed this year special appreciation goes to ISAP Participants and friends whose workshops afforded our sense of sharing in the history of Monte Verità, and took us directly into the realms of chaos, synchronicity and creative play: Christa Robinson with the I Ching; Marco Della Chiesa with psychodrama; Eileen Nemeth with dream enactment; Allan Guggenbühl with mytho-drama; and Inge Missmahl with dance/movement, and also with her twilight open air dance performance that invited audience participation.

Our memorable excursion to Eranos began with introductions by Christa Robinson and the Foundation president, Dr. Fabio Merlini. To our surprise the coffee break in the garden came with wonderful cakes, freshly baked and graciously offered by the Eranos manager Gisela Binda. Two JO lectures at *this* historic place were followed by a picnic lunch on the shore of Lago Maggiore. A second excursion took us by boat to the exotic gardens on Brissago Island. Our gala farewell commenced with a candle-light concert by Lisa Sokolov and ended with dancing for all—with music once again superbly mixed and DJ'ed by ISAP Participant Andrew Fellows.

While looking forward to Spring's publication of the morning lectures in the *Jungian Odyssey Series IV*, we are sailing full steam ahead toward the next Jungian Odyssey: "Love: Traversing Its Peaks and Valleys," June 2012, at the Hotel Paxmontana in Flüeli-Ranft.
