Within the staff itself, there have been changes in personnel; our long-standing operational director Karin Buchser has turned to new endeavors. We were available to gain a competent successor in Susanne Chapuis. Susanne Chapuis has been able to quickly settle in and we are confident that our operational management is in the best of hands. The position in the Front Office has been recently filled with the placement of the charming Sandra Steiner.

ISAPZURICH's students are an active and dedicated group. The Student Representatives, presented to the IC an extensive and stimulating catalog of questions and concerns. Themes of transparency, information and comprehensive participation in decision-making processes were on the agenda. The IC was committed to make great efforts in considering these concerns seriously. Issues of transparency and the availability of accessible information regarding the current challenges and processes hold priority within the agenda. This reinforcement was established in contact with the Student Representatives and furthermore in direct contact with the students themselves. The students were invited to an extraordinary Information and Discussion session concerning itself on Charta and Accreditation.

In an Institution, organized on the basis of democracy such as ISAPZURICH, the accessibility of information is of central importance. Due to this, ISAPZURICH organizes in cooperation with accreditation groups extraordinary Information Sessions. The aim of these sessions for ISAPZURICH is to enable relevant information as well as the participation of the events' participants and students.

An E-Forum was introduced at the GV session on the 20th of October in order to strengthen ISAPZURICH's internal discussion medium. This Forum is used actively. Discussion themes are the planned workshop with CGJI and the queries related to accreditation.

Our core work is that the formation of our analysts continues to blossom for the better. The program offers a multifaceted and comprehensive training course. Moreover, ISAPZURICH has an excellent reputation in the international context. For this, one must be grateful to all our Lecturers and participants of the faculty and the respective Program Commission.

For the public, ISAZPZURICH engages itself in organizing exceptional events such as the Jungian Odyssey, the „Märztagung“ and the Zurich Lecture Series.

The Jungian Odyssey was based on exploring „Love Traversing its Peaks and Valleys“, the eternal theme of love and its multifaceted aspects.

An already internationally recognized event is the annual tradition of hosting the „Zurich Lecture Series“ in October. The theme was „Trauma and Beyond, the Mystery



of Transformation" by Ursula Wirtz. The Zurich Lecture Series is a joint event organized in cooperation between ISAPZURICH and Spring Journal Books New Orleans. We warmly thank Nancy Carter for her engagement- without this the event would not have been made possible.

The event of „Märztagung" is where ISAPZURICH shows itself in the German-speaking platform. The outstanding presentations and workshops exploring Gender could in fact fascinate quite a large part of its audience. Respectively, we kindly thank AG „deutschsprachiges Program".



A special mention must be made to our in-house Theater Group: John Hill, Paul Brutsche, Murray Stein and Dariane Pictet. They brought forth fundamental contents from the Red Book in a visually stimulating way on stage. The performances took place on C.C. Jung Memorial Day, at the AGAP-Symposium and as well in far-lying St. Petersburg (with a legendary disappearing act of Paul Brutsche alias C.G.Jung!). There are rumors

that a performance in Peking is planned.

Institutional Queries:

All requirements were met for the provisional accreditation of our „Charta-Program". We kindly thank the accreditation group. The final decision from the „Bundesamt für Gesundheit" (the Federal Office for Health) is to be expected at the beginning of 2013.

Due to the exceptional commitment of Isabelle Meier, it was enabled that, a number of our students were able to benefit from the **transition policies**. The option of enrolling in courses in science methodology, Philosophy, Ethics, Law as well as others will be offered to students internally within ISAPZURICH which was not previously available.

The formulation of a framework of requisites outlined in the „Erforderniskatalog" will define the definitive accreditation of the Psychotherapy course. In addition, the new Psychology Labor Law will also come into force in beginning 2013 that means the IC and the membership of ISAPZURICH will have its work cut out! A broad risk and chance analysis discussion on the definitive accreditation system has been launched. At the Information and Discussion Presentation as well as within the E-Forum there is an active exchange of constructive ideas.

Our Neighbours:

Talks with the Directive of the C.G. Jung Institute took place. The IC finds it important that before concrete steps and projects of cooperation can be formulated, a fundamental discussion regarding possibilities, chances and risk evaluation of cooperation and competition needs to take place. On the 20 of April 2013 a workshop led by

Friedrich Glasl will take place where these questions can be discussed. Such a workshop led by a visionary perspective is highly endorsed by the participants of ISAPZURICH as well as the analyst body of the CGJI.

In addition the relationship/rapport to CGJI faces the query of the programs standard which is led by the acceptance in the AGAP and therefore in the International Society of IAAP. Talks regarding Membership Standards Board were held under the leadership of AGAP in 2012. Consequently, another one is planned for January 2013.

Future prospects:

We as the Co-Presidents and on behalf of the entire IC are confronted with large challenges. At a Strategy Conference we discussed and carried out a strategic analysis for ISAPZURICH regarding the organization itself and the time we are in. It became all the more clearer to us that Jungian Psychology holds important value and necessity and plays an important role in both the present and the future. It offers with its approach to exploration into the Sense of Meaning and Purpose and Discovery of the Self to the postmodern individual - a valuable aid to orientation. The genuine Jungian point of view with the emphasis on the Symbolic and the Constructive with the focus on mental transformation, in contrast to fighting against symptoms, is the core being of ISAPZURICH. These „essentials“ have to be made clearer and more visible in the future.

We look forward to the year ahead which surely will bring forth many exciting questions and decisions. We shall not be short of our tasks/work!

Jungian Odyssey

In 2012 we returned to Flüeli Ranft, the place of the very first Jungian Odyssey (2006). This time, however, our venue was the beautiful Hotel Pax Montana, built in 1895 and freshly renovated to restore its Art Nouveau interior. The hospitality was excellent, and fortunately all of our courses were accommodated in the one building, as was also the lodging and dining for all participants. As in previous years, wide interest in Analytical Psychology and the Odyssey itself was demonstrated with the enrollment of 89 participants (including our own analysts and students), who hailed from some 20 different countries and a wide variety of professional backgrounds.



Inspired by the *genius loci* our topic was *Love: Traversing Its Peaks and Valleys*. Co-Presidents Marco della Chiesa and Isabelle Meier struck a note of welcome with their talks on love and Brother Klaus. We were honored by Ann Ulanov's presence as keynote speaker, and also by the presence of our returning guests, James Hollis and Mark Hederman. The JOCom wishes to thank so many ISAP Participants and friends—too many to name here—whose contributions make the program possible, and more importantly, make the JO an edifying, rich and timely event.

We were privileged to welcome SGAP president Josef Marty, who led a tour of Brother Klaus's birth house, and the chapel and cell where this famous Swiss mystic spent the last twenty years of his life as a hermit. A large number of Odyssey participants



braved the steep railway ascent to Mt. Pilatus, and arrived to find themselves treading in snow! Leading up to our traditional gala closing dinner dance, with music DJ'd by Andrew Fellows, we honored the members stepping down from the JOCom: John Hill, who founded the Jungian Odyssey and began to serve as Academic Chair in 2004; and Isabelle Meier, who served as Co-Chair for 6 successive Odysseys. At the same time the baton was handed over to their respective successors, Ursula Wirtz and Deborah Egger.

We wouldn't want to close without thanking Helga Kopecky, who always insures that we have a good supply of relevant titles for the JO book sales. This year, sales were so vigorous that she had to send us a second supply! We are indebted as well to the ISAP students who managed the book sales and technical equipment: Susanne Bucher, Rose Nichol, David Marcus Schmid, Isolde Kunerth, and Katarzyna Wach. Last but certainly not least our gratitude goes to Margareta Ehnberg, who again documented the JO with her exquisite photography, and has made it available to all of us on her website: <http://s.ehnberg.net/JO2012>.

We look forward to Spring's publication of the year's *Jungian Odyssey Series*, and remain grateful to Nancy Cater for her continuing publication and other support of the JO. Due to a new requirement to pin down Odyssey dates and venues 2-3 years in advance, the JOCom has been busily scoping out possible sites since the fall of 2012. Come June 2013, we will happily immerse ourselves in the quietude of the Odyssey at Kartause Ittingen and the *Echoes of Silence: Listening to Soul, Self, Other*.
