

ANNUAL REPORT 2020

President's Remarks - Deborah Egger





2020 has been an extraordinary year for the world and also for ISAP. Swiss federal measures to cope with Covid-19 forced ISAP's 2020 Spring Semester completely on line, a herculean task we accomplished in literally 48 hours, March 16-18. This intense launch was followed by an amazing effort from ISAP teachers, staff, and IC, supported by our IT Consultant, to offer to the students as full a semester of training as was humanly possible.

At the same time we were forced into an early launch of the new interactive website, which has proven invaluable in keeping up with all the program changes with which we had to contend, www.isapzurich.com.

Autumn Semester 2020, also under the shadow of the corona virus, morphed into an hybrid version of our standard program, having as much on site teaching as was allowed by the cantonal and federal authorities, combined with Zoomed classes both for the wider public and registered students.

The stresses of the pandemic took their toll on us all, but with the financial support of JITZ, AGAP, and other patrons and donors, as well as extra effort given by the staff and support staff, combined with flexibility and a generous spirit from the student body, we have come through it, somewhat scarred, but together.

Since all special events, except the Märztagung, were cancelled or postponed in 2020, this Annual Report will be lacking reports from the Jungian Odyssey, Zurich Lecture Series, Visiting Group Projects and other highlights from the year, which simply could not take place in this extraordinary year. We will share with you some memories of virtual meetings including the General Assembly in March, a community chat on Covid-19 and a closing virtual event in May.

We were fortunate to have a small, informal gathering to begin the Autumn Semester and therefore could meet our four new students in person. And we celebrated a moving hybrid graduation event, with 32 persons socially distanced in S1 and a larger audience via Zoom.

Close to the end of his life, Jung was asked in an interview about his notion of God. His reply: "To this day God is the name by which I designate all things which cross my willful path violently and recklessly, all things which upset my subjective views, plans and intentions and change the course of my life for better or worse." (1961)

We closed the year at ISAP, tired and spent, but reflecting on the meaning, significance and purpose of the pandemic for our school, humanity and the earth.

Program Committee - Nancy Krieger

The Program Committee has had a very busy year. For the Spring semester we offered (in double hours)

- 56 double hours of lectures and open seminars
- 98 double hours of seminars
- A total of seven colloquia, one training in expressive therapy, and one chat

But then came the Covid restrictions on 18 March, 2020!

10 double hours of lectures and open seminars were cancelled, but 16 were added. (Thank you very, very much for all who jumped in spontaneously to save the semester for the students!!)

15 double hours of seminars had to be cancelled. Seminars cannot be added because of the need for preregistration.

The colloquia were maintained on Zoom by the students. We thank them also for assuming this immense task.

Unfortunately, the sessions in expressive therapy and the chat were cancelled.

There were also changes to the Autumn semester, but not as much. In a sense we were lucky. By 18 March, when ISAP was faced with the consequences of the virus, the deadline for proposals for Autumn had already passed, but they had not yet been scheduled. We offered:

- 77 double hours of lectures and open seminars
- 64 double hours of seminars
- A total of nine colloquia, one training in expressive therapy, and one chat

Again 10 double hours of lectures and open seminars needed to be cancelled along with six double hours of seminars, mainly because of presenters not being able to travel to Switzerland and/or the material not being appropriate for Zoom.

Again, the session in expressive therapy and the chat were cancelled.

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For Spring 2021, and again for Autumn, we have added more information on the Jotform about the possibilities for zooming, which vary with each course, so we hope we will be able to manage these semesters with less work and stress for all. We regret all the course cancellations, and thank everyone who came in to offer replacement courses so that our students did not lose anything from their semester of training.

Due to the excellent Zoom technology and the willingness of the ISAP staff and others to take over hosting, often outside of ISAP's normal office hours, we have shared our public program with a wide audience who may not have attended otherwise.

The Program Committee also organized a 'Covid Chat' on Wednesday 29 April in the early evening, which was attended by 37 analysts and students. Two analysts and three students

presented how the Covid restrictions had affected them. Many others contributed to the report 'Corona and Me', which is available on the ISAP website in the Analyst Portal under Analyst Downloads: https://www.isapzurich.com/en/analyst-portal/analyst-downloads/

I speak for the whole Program Committee when I thank you all again for spontaneous way in which each of you has helped, in whatever way possible, to make 2020 a really exceptional year for ISAP.

Task Force Accreditation AGAK

The task force had to follow the wishes of the BAG for the 3rd time and delivered in April the last supplement to the documentation handed over in 2015. The annual meeting of ISAP of 28.3.20 had approved these last changes. The ASP (Association of Swiss Psychotherapists) acted here again as responsible and guarantor of the quality of our training. The CH program had already been provisionally accredited in 2017. In May 2020 came the confirmation of the definitive accreditation, valid until March 2024. The

task force concentrated then on the revision of the quality standards, proposed by the BAG as the basis for the renewal round. Our criticisms and suggestions were almost entirely adopted by the ASP in June and contributed to important improvements in the new quality standards announced in December.

Märztagung - Paul Brutsche

The theme of the March meeting 2020 was "IMAGINATION - On the way to the inner images". In view of the outbreak of the Corona pandemic, we had been considering for a long time whether the March meeting could be held at ISAP or whether we should forego it as a precaution. As a result of these circumstances, fewer people than usual had registered and among those who had already decided to participate, several subsequently withdrew their commitment due to the situation, and therefore the number of participants shrank to an unusual 15 people, plus 8 speakers and AGDP people, i.e. to a reasonable 23 people. This meant that the protective measures required by the BAG (Federal Office of Health), in particular with regard to the use of space, could be complied without any problems and we decided to hold the meeting. Therefore, the March 2020 meeting became the last event at ISAP that could be held on site for more than a year.

Our courage was rewarded insofar as no one of our "Little flag of the 23 upright" caught a contagion.

In the morning we had two presentations on the distinctly Jungian theme of imagination: Paul Brutsche, PhD spoke on 'Imagination and Soul Transformation', Isabelle Meier, PhD on 'Being under Water - The Symbol of Due Water Imaginations'. in to circumstances, the afternoon events were limited to the following three workshops: Margareta Ehnberg, MSC 'Introduction to Sandplay', Lucienne Marguerat, lic.phil. 'What Colors Tell' and Katharina Casanova, lic.phil. and Ilsabe von Uslar, lic.phil. offered a 'Guided Imagination and Figuration'.

The conference was concluded by a lively and stimulating panel discussion. The event was rounded off by the traditional aperitif, which took place in the café under the sign of Corona, where it was easier to keep the distance rules.

Graduation 2020

To our relief and pleasure the Autumn Semester 2020 ended on December 4th with Graduation celebration at ISAP as well as on zoom. To comply with the restrictions, tables for four persons each were set up in S1 at the proper distance. We welcomed two of our diploma graduates (Esti Forkosh and Dian Abdurachman --- unfortunately Jongtae Woo and Tomoo Seki could not be present ---) and awarded Certificates to Asha Räber and Aderyn Wood. Some family members, friends and analysts attended in person and others chimed in from across the world, projected onto a big screen. Rodney Waters provided inspiring musical and poetic interludes. The whole ceremony was deeply moving and after months unending of semiconfinement it was a great joy to be able gather again and celebrate in a nearly normal way.

Finance Report - Daniela Droescher

The lock down during the pandemic in the Spring 2020 was an utterly new experience for all of us. Life suddenly stopped, we had to reorient ourselves, and look for ways how we could continue. Our priority was, how could we keep ISAP functioning and provide the best possible training during this unusual and stressful time.

We took a leap of faith and launched ourselves in the unknown. It was thanks to our solid financial base we could afford the expertise of our IT consultant who within 48 hours made sure ISAP lectures continued via Zoom with no cancelations of lectures and no loss of students. As ISAP continued in this new style of teaching, it soon became apparent to our IT expert, we shall have to invest in new state of the art equipment if we wish to continue to provide the high professional standard ISAP is known for. This of course meant more financial investment and more responsibility for the IC. However, already after a few months our investment into Zoom started to pay off. The general public became aware of our lectures and paid fees to listen and view lectures on their screens from the comfort of their homes anywhere in world. confident that this interest in ZOOM lectures will continue also in the years to come and prove to be new a source of income for ISAP.

The autumn semester proved to be even more challenging for the organization of onsite and zoomed lectures as we had to react to the Corona measures of many different countries. Thanks to the very good infrastructure installed, also these challenges were mastered very well and all our students continue in their studies. This makes the year

very successful, also from a financial point of view as the income from student fees was almost as high as in 2017. This was the year in which 10 students graduated and we had to fight to increase the number of students again. The slight increase in student fees of course helped to achieve this result.

ISAP was granted Kurzarbeitsentschädigung as well as a rent reduction by the landlord. This helped mitigate the negative impact of the Corona crisis. We are very happy about this material contribution.

During this year we were faced with cancelation of JO, ZLS and personalized block courses, which of course had a negative financial impact. We hope that in 2021, at least some of these courses and events can take place.

The Märztagung took place the very last weekend before the lockdown and we are quite happy that it was well received.

For the future, to increase awareness of ISAP, we are developing a podcast project with the aim of being able to download lectures from the website.

Even as late as September 2020 we anticipated a big financial loss for the whole year 2020. We are overwhelmed to report that the ISAP community and JITZ made substantial donations to help in this extraordinary year. Despite the challenging year, the financial markets performed very well and we are happy about the positive contribution of the wealth management.

Library - Carol McGinty

In 2020 our services and working hours were limited as a result of the Corona pandemic, from April to the end of August. Despite this, ISAP students still had requests for us in the library and bookshop, even during the lockdown, and we were able to make resources available to them. Thanks to continued access to grant money, we were able to order items from Zentralbibliothek and purchase all the books that were requested by students and analysts. Through such purchases we can really enrich our library; furthermore, as improved infrastructure we have some new storage and display shelves and better study tables for our library.

We continue to try out a useful resource, DeepDyve. A subscription to another recommended resource for psychotherapists, PEP-Web, is in the works. Also, we have been in the process of improving the quality of an image database that should be quite useful for our students and analysts.

Civilization in Transition - Carol Brandt

The annual Civilization in Transition (CIT 8) Conference sponsored by JITZ was scheduled for November of 2020 in Santa Fe, New Mexico. Given the pandemic limitations, CIT 8 has been re-scheduled for November 4-7 2021. The Conference title is Psyche & Earth: A Relationship in Crisis – a topic more relevant than ever in our current culture. features keynote speaker Andrew Fellows, author of Gaia, Psyche and Deep Ecology -Navigating Climate Change Anthropocene. The program also welcomes speakers Jeffrey Kiehl, Lori Pye and Yuriko Sato. The Conference will offer lecture and inter-active formats explore the interconnection of all things, the personal and

Zurich Lecture Series 2020 - Murray Stein

The Zürich Lecture Series (ZLS) scheduled for October, 2020, was cancelled due to the pandemic, yet the ZLS Committee was grateful and pleased to offer an abridgment in the form of an hour-long lecture via Zoom by intended featured guest speaker, Nancy Furlotti, on the ZLS volume titled A Story of Dreams, Fate and Destiny by Erel Shalit. The book was published by Chiron Publications in conjunction with the scheduled ZLS 2020.

Postlude lectures were offered by Peter Ammann, Jody Schlatter, and Yuriko Sato on the two subsequent days, live at ISAP and widely viewed on Zoom. Just prior to those, Anna Bernasconi led a local excursion that was well attended by enthusiastic ISAP candidates, celebrating the Legend of the Stag and the founding of the Fraumünster Church in Zurich.

Plans for the ZLS 2021, scheduled for October 1-2, 2021, will be reviewed in June in order to make any further adjustments in light of the global and local environment. The speaker this vear will be Prof. Roderick Main of Essex on "The University (UK) Undoina Disenchantment: Mystery, Metaphysics, and Meaning in the Work of C. G. Jung." A book with the same title will be published simultaneously and offered for sale in conjunction with the lectures. An interview with Prof. Main can be viewed by clicking on "Interview" on the relevant page of the ISAP website. Following the lectures, there will be an excursion offered to the Museum Haus C.G. Jung and as usual several Postlude lectures by ISAP analysts and a panel discussion on the topic "The Self: Individual and Community Aspects."


