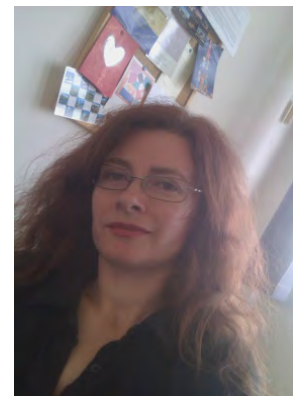
**Angelica Löwe, MA**
