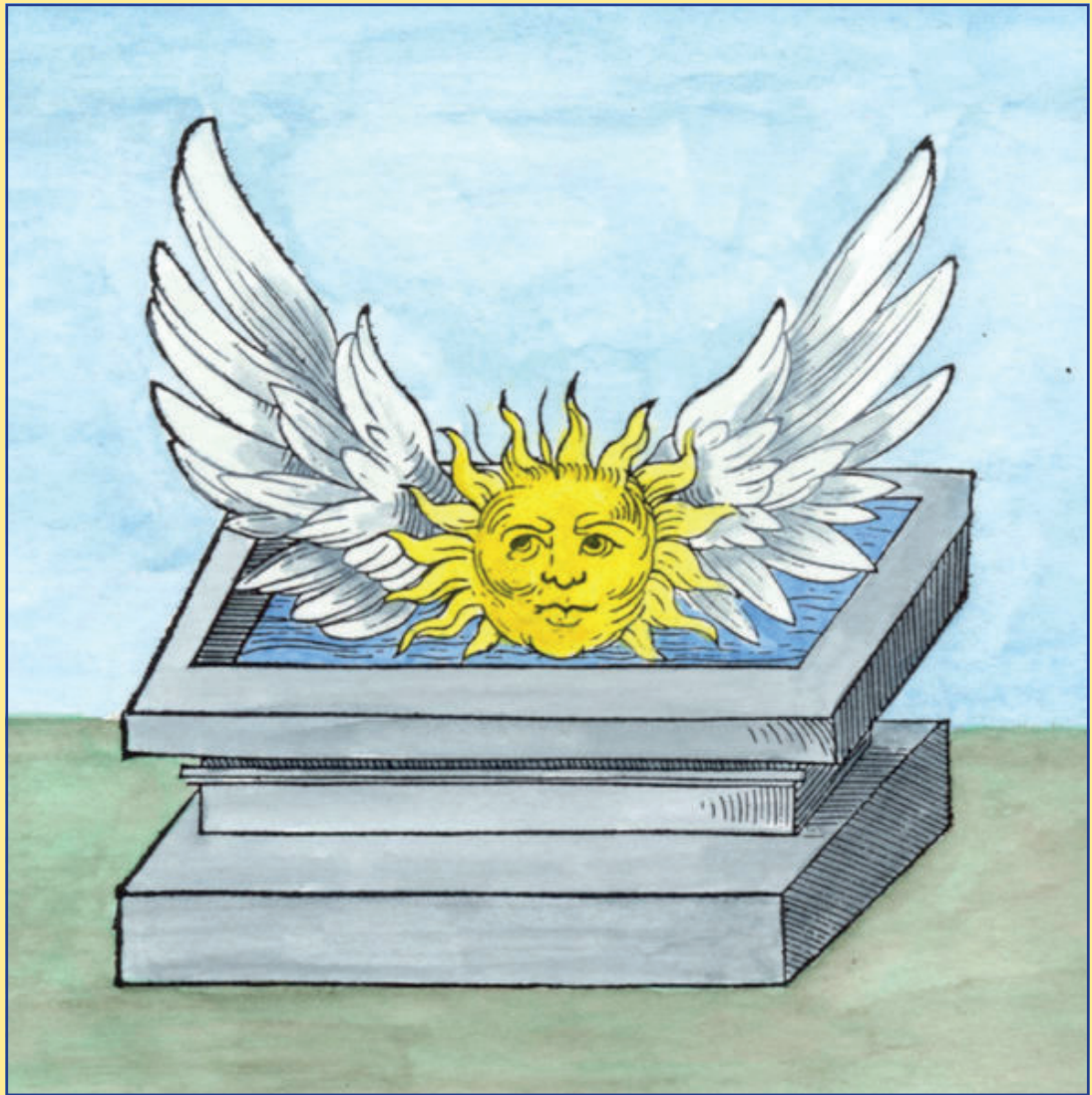

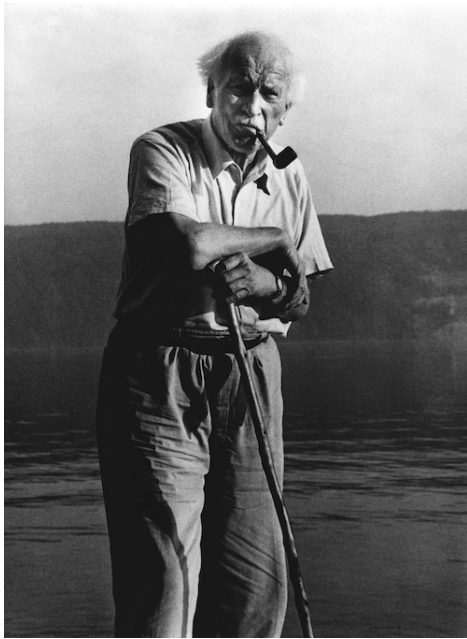

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The Alchemical Mind: Carl Jung, Tibetan Buddhism, and Francisco Varela

Leslie de Galbert, BA, D.E.S.S.

In *The Alchemical Mind: Carl Jung, Tibetan Buddhism, and Francisco Varela*, Jungian analyst Leslie de Galbert brings a new perspective to the relationship between Jung and Buddhism by introducing the work of Chilean scientist and philosopher Francisco Varela (1946–2001). Jung stressed the importance of remaining faithful to one’s own cultural origins and found that Westerners were too rooted in Cartesian mind-body dualism to be able to experience the nondualism of Eastern contemplative practices. Yet he also posited that the archetypes of the collective unconscious are universal. Can this paradox be resolved?

When His Holiness the Dalai Lama and Francisco Varela co-founded the Mind and Life Institute in 1987, they did so in the belief that interdisciplinary dialogues

between Western scientists and Eastern contemplatives might offer new insights into the mind and consciousness. Varela brought not just neurobiology but also his concept of embodied enactive cognition into dialogue with the Buddhist epistemologies of Tibetan monastics.

Galbert shows how analytical psychology resonates deeply with this idea of openness and dialogue as a means to building a bridge between different viewpoints and different cultures. *The Alchemical Mind* lays down a path where an encounter between analytical psychology, Tibetan Buddhism, and the ideas of Francisco Varela enriches and deepens our understanding of *mind*.

The Golem – an Old Prophetic Illustration of the Crisis of our Industrial Consumer Civilisation and its Spirit

Since medieval times, there have been stories about figures made of clay animated by the name of God inscribed on their forehead. Initially these Golems were only symbolic of the power of God, but gradually this power was used for domestic tasks. These Golems easily followed the instructions of their makers, but had the critical feature of permanent growth, thus endangering – with no ill intent – the house and its inhabitants. The last Golem stories show desperate attempts to stop this destructive growth. This myth will allow us to look at our present-day collective civilisational situation.

And the Bridegroom Was a Bird... “The Feather of Finist, the Bright Falcon”

The short-lived bliss of a young girl is shattered through the malice of her two sisters. Leaving all behind, she sets out on a long and arduous journey in search of her love. This is a Russian fairy tale from Alexander Afanasjev’s collection, a contemporary of the Grimm Brothers.

As Jung observed, the old gods did not disappear under modern scientific scrutiny. They were exiled, only to reappear as pathology and a culture increasingly estranged from the world it inhabits. The ecological crisis is the outer symptom of an inner split. This talk reads the Roman-era "death of the Great God Pan" as a diagnostic myth of modern disenchantment: the split between an archaic psyche embedded in an ensouled nature and a modern psyche that "straightens things up" through logic. The work, then, is to recover the mythic psyche as a guide toward a renewed relation to nature.

Using the 12th century Persian story “The Conference of the Birds” – an allegory of the mystical journey – this lecture portrays the spiritual path and its dangers, many of which also apply to the analytical process. The Swiss psychiatrist Christian Scharfetter (1936–2012) lists a range of symptoms of spiritual crises: fanaticism, narcissistic inflation, obsession, loss of control, mania, delusion, loss of reality, psychotic ego disintegration, sleeplessness, self-doubt, anxiety, depression, despair, inner emptiness, restlessness, withdrawal from society and isolation.

Jungian Keynotes Lecture Series

The 2,000,000-Microsecond-Old Man

In the industrialised world, our attention spans, both individually and collectively, are becoming ever shorter. I will outline the factors contributing to this relatively recent phenomenon, especially the role of digital media, and link this to Jung's critique of our "monotheism of consciousness." I will then elaborate some of the resulting dangers due to our failure, again individually and collectively, to deal with long-term problems such as extreme wealth inequality, forced migration, climate breakdown and biodiversity loss.

Christiana Morgan and her Tower of Dreams

In 1926, Christiana Morgan, inspired by her analysis with Jung, built a tower on a bluff above a river in Massachusetts, and called it the Tower on the Marsh. It became an expression of her individuation process and a spiritual retreat; it can be seen as the American Bollingen. Hilary Morgan, granddaughter of Christiana, will present her 26-minute film "Tower of Dreams," followed by a PowerPoint presentation about the symbols in the Tower.

Calatonia – Jungian Oriented Subtle Bodywork

Dr. Sándor Pethö, MD and psychologist, created this type of bodywork in Hungary and developed it in Brazil after WWII. A pioneer in Jungian work in Brazil, he trained a group of psychotherapists, occupational therapists, physiotherapists and others in this method. The goal is to facilitate patients' contact and perception of inner aspects of the psyche through body sensations. Touches are subtle and gentle, in the feet, head and over the body. The sensation function and its correlated intuition function are mobilized. Memories, dreams, and psychic material appear, integrating psychotherapy and bodywork.
