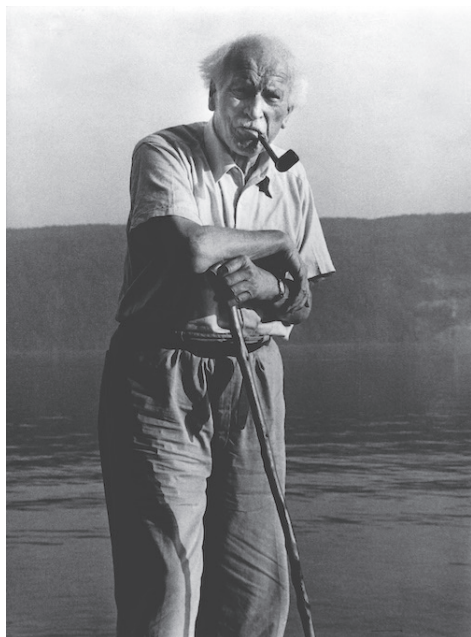

Prof. Fanny Brewster, PhD



Fanny is a Jungian analyst and writer residing in New York City. A graduate of the C.G. Jung Institute of New York, she is a lecturer at the New York Foundation for Analytical Psy-

chology and a member analyst of the Philadelphia Association for Analytical Psychology (PAJA).

Fanny was first drawn to Jungian Psychology by her wish to study dreams and the dreaming life, which she did at Pacifica Graduate Institute. Realizing her ensuing desire to change her profession from that of a Speech Pathologist to one of a Psychologist, she went on to earn her PhD in Clinical Psychology at Pacifica, where she is now a professor and Core Faculty member in the Depth Psychology Specialization in Integrative Therapy and Healing Practices.

Fanny presents internationally, both lecturing and leading workshops on dreams, creative writing, and mythology. Her journey has also entailed her Zen Buddhist practice, her MFA studies in Creative Nonfiction, and her on-going vocation as a poet and writer of fiction and non-fiction. Craig, Canadian by birth, is a Jungian analyst who lives and practices in New York City, where he also serves on the faculty of the Jungian Psycho-

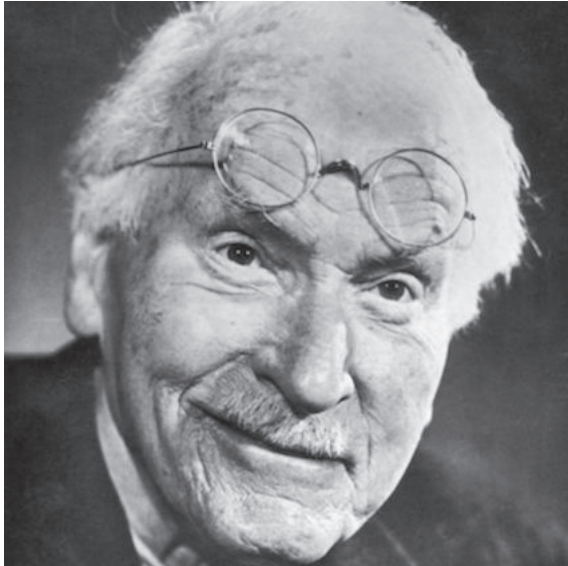
analytic Association (JPA). Before moving to New York, he practiced for 12 years in Paris, France.

Craig is a graduate of the C.G. Jung Institute Zurich. He also received a diploma from the Institute for Psychodrama in Zumikon, reflecting his passion and earlier engagement in theater and music, and leading to his work as a psychodrama practitioner. He obtained his PhD from the Centre for Psychoanalytic Studies, University of Essex.

From 2004 – 2013 Craig served variously on the AGAP Ethics Committee and the AGAP Executive Committee. He later served as Director of Training at JPA.

Craig's international presentations have included two Jungian Odysseys (2011 & 2013). In 2015 he was the featured speaker at ISAP's Zurich Lecture Series, from which ensued the publication of his book, *Ages of Anxiety: Jung's Types as Inspiration for Poetry, Music and Dance* (Spring Journal and Books, 2016).
